Canyon Church Camp



For more than 70 years, Canyon Church Camp has offered camping ministry to children, youth and adults at our location nestled in the heart of the beautiful Waterton Lakes National Park. Our mission is to nurture Christian faith through fun and fellowship in God's great outdoors.

In 2017 the Kenow Wildfire swept through camp and destroyed half of our buildings. We have been working ever since to rebuild it. A 21-year License of Occupation with Parks Canada has been secured and camp rebuilding will begin in the spring of 2023. This includes installing a new wastewater system, bringing our current buildings up to code, and reinstating the utilities along with building bathrooms, 4 camper cabins, staff accommodations, the craft shack, and a first aid station.

The fire has given the landscape new life and CCC an opportunity to improve our facility. This includes increasing the accessibility of our facility for diverse user groups focused on environmental education opportunities. With the addition of gender-neutral, accessible washrooms and a sustainable design plan to reduce our ecological footprint, we are planning for the camp's future.

Kasota East Camp is located on beautiful Sylvan Lake. We are proud to be accredited by the Alberta Camp Association and United Church Camping Association. During July and August we offer summer camps for children and families. Our program includes a blend of traditional activities including swimming, canoeing and paddle boarding, archery and slingshots, campfires, gaga ball, and campouts, along with trendy activities that are updated yearly. Each day we provide time for campers to explore faith and fellowship through our Community Conversations and Vespers services. Our camps explore United Church values in an inclusive, no-pressure context. Connect with God in a beautiful setting with the best people! KEC offers affordable camper fees and financial assistance is available through our Campership Fund.

When camp isn't in session, our beautiful facilities are available for rental groups. Our commercial dining hall, heated cabins, full service washhouse, and outdoor pavilion with fire pit, allow us to accommodate a wide variety of rental groups including retreats, weddings, and conferences. Income from rentals helps us maintain our facilities, but KEC also relies heavily on volunteers and donations from our congregations. We are always looking for new ways to partner with supporting congregations and camp alumni.

Lighting of The Candles

(This liturgy is written for a set up of three candles) We are gathered as beloved community. We light candles to remind ourselves of the presence of Holy.

Let these lights warm us, sustain us, and signify our collective prayers, offered in good faith, entering the light of the Creator.

With our first candle we proclaim the life and teachings of Jesus Christ, who was born to a woman in poverty, in a time of social upheaval, and political oppression. Who knew human joy and suffering, and who preached of liberation not domination. May we live peacefully together.

Jesus preached of reconciliation between peoples. Our second candle represents our commitment to Reconciliation. We recommit ourselves to the principles and actions needed for de-colonized society.

May this candle remind us of our responsibility to act in solidarity and in hope.

Jesus preached of love, Affirmation, and inclusion. This candle represents our commitment to being an Affirming community.

We Affirm the Holy beauty of every person.

You are beloved because of who you are, how you identify, and who you love.

May this light represent our radical welcome and remind us that the Holy spirit shines through every one of us, in all our diversity.

We light these candles to remember, to celebrate, to welcome.

Exploring the Word Intergenerationally

Ispy

Background

Campers, young leaders, and people of all ages encounter the Divine and the Holy Spirit in creation and the ministry of camps. As part of Camping Sunday, we decorate our sanctuary spaces to remind us of how we experience The Holy at camp in creation.

Set-Up Instructions

Consider placing some camping items and other decorations around the sanctuary: backpacks, sleeping bags, headlamps, paper cut-outs of birds, trees, animals, maybe even a tent or mock-campfire.

Activity

Invite the congregation to notice the items and imagery around the sanctuary. Perhaps ask some wondering conversations with the congregation:

- · What do you "Spy?"
- · Does it bring back any memories of a camping ministry experience?
- · Have you ever had spiritual experience in nature? What was it?
- · Do you remember learning something new at camp?
- · Does it make you think of a favourite camp activity?

Wondering

At camp we're invited to arrive as our authentic selves. We leave behind our homework, hometowns and home bases for a little while to explore new relationships and ways of being. We learn how to be humble and helpful; we lift up each other's gifts and live by community rules. The memories of the fun, trust and authentic love stay with us for a lifetime. We delight in remembering them. How can experience of camp transform our relationship with God? How can camping ministry transform everyday congregational life? What are some parts of camping ministry we can bring into everyday ministry?

Blessing Of Camp

Dear Creator God.

As we gather to celebrate Camping Sunday, we remember all of our Camps in the United Church of Canada, from the rainy coast of Vancouver Island, to the mountains of the Yukon, to the plains of the Prairies, to the forests of Central Ontario, to the windswept seas of the Maritimes. Let each child experience your love through the fresh air, campfires, songs, good food, and fellowship of others in your creation.

Bless each backpack and sleeping bag, as each camper experiences your love,

Bless each headlamp and first aid kit of each leader and volunteer who lovingly cares for each child in their care.

And bless each camp in our church as they go into a season of making memories that will last a lifetime.

Prayers of The People

Preparation:

Ahead of time, prepare paper hearts to hand out to the community. Create a 'community map' either on a cloth or paper locating your community of faith and the camp to which you are connected and celebrating today in worship. Use this 'map' to receive the heart prayers.

Alternatively, you may wish to simply ask people to turn in the direction of a camp to which the congregation has an affinity.

This would also be a time where you could use the PowerPoint Slide of the Camp locations.

For your personal prayer, I invite you to write a word, a name, a place or draw your prayer on the paper heart. This is the prayer that's in your heart

Creator God, source of love, we celebrate your presence in and around us. We give thanks for the length and breadth and depth of ministry in the camps within our United Church of Canada. Thank you for INSERT CAMP NAME. Thank you for this place and the space of acceptance, fun, faith, and adventure that has been and is a part of this camp. Thank you for the ways in which this camp shares your love and call to be in community. Inspire us today to participate in the ministry of camp in concrete ways.

This day we pray for peace. We pray for peace and justice for our siblings in our community, church, workplace, and across our world. We pray for peace within our own hearts and minds.

Compassionate God, empower us to live out your message of love and care in our world. Help us to see you in the face of those we meet. Hold us close in our own hurt and remind each of us of your unfailing love. Help us to remember that your love is supportive, loyal, hopeful, and trusting and to live this kind of love out in our community and in our camps.

We name out loud or write on the paper heart prayers that we hold in our heart on this day.

We join these prayers together with the prayer that Jesus taught us...

And at the end of this time of prayer you are invited to paste your prayer on the map.
